

Dr. Sharon Byrdsong *Interim Superintendent, Norfolk Public Schools*



Dr. Sharon I. Byrdsong was appointed as the Acting Superintendent of Schools by the School Board of the City of Norfolk on June 19, 2019, and she officially assumed the duties of the chief executive on July 6, 2019. Dr. Byrdsong's tenure with Norfolk Public Schools spans over a period of twenty years.

Dr. Byrdsong's career began in the classroom as a high school teacher in the Wake County Public School System upon graduating magna cum laude from North Carolina State University with a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree. Upon receiving a Master of School Administration (MSA) degree from the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Dr. Byrdsong went on to serve as a high school assistant

principal before moving with her family to the Hampton Roads area. She was then appointed as the assistant principal of Northside Middle School within Norfolk Public Schools; and one year later, she was promoted as the principal of Azalea Gardens Middle School (AGMS) within the school division. During Dr. Byrdsong's tenure as the principal of AGMS, she was able to successfully turnaround this school, which was once deemed as a low-performing school by the school division and the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE). Dr. Byrdsong's turnaround efforts eventually resulted in Azalea Gardens Middle School being named a "Virginia School to Watch" by the Virginia Middle School Association.

Dr. Byrdsong's experiences as a central office administrator include serving in the role of: senior director of alternative options; executive director of secondary schools; executive director of human resources; assistant superintendent of human resources; chief of staff; and executive director of interagency collaboration and wraparound services. Dr. Byrdsong holds a Division Superintendent License and a Postgraduate Professional License from the Virginia Board of Education and a Doctor of Education from Regent University, where she was the recipient of the Outstanding Aluma of the First Decade of the 2000's Award.

Jim Curran

Pastor, Basilica of St. Mary's Catholic Church St. Paul's Development Coalition

Father Jim Curran was born and raised in Central Islip, New York. It was his four-year service in the Navy that first brought him to Norfolk, Virginia. At the end of his military enlistment, he remained in the Hampton Roads area where he was employed as a flight dispatcher for a Lear Jet Operator at Patrick Henry Field, currently known as Newport News/Williamsburg Airport.

Fr. Jim answered the call to the priesthood by enrolling in St. Mary's Seminary and University in Baltimore, MD in 1993. Fr. Curran was ordained a priest for the Diocese of Richmond on May 27, 2000. Since then, Father Jim has served as a priest chaplain



at the College of William and Mary, James Madison University; an associate pastor at St. Bede in Williamsburg and Pastor of St. Joan of Arc in Yorktown and is currently proud and honored to serve as Pastor of the Basilica of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception in Norfolk, the only African-American Basilica in the United States.

Father Jim first discovered the Basilica as a deacon, where he served for a year in 1999. It is his greatest honor and blessing to return for the second time to serve as Pastor. He is also the Chaplain for Saint Patrick's Catholic School and serves on the Board for the Diocese of Richmond Pastors Advisory Committee. Fr. Jim has also been a member



of the board of Habitat for Humanity, St. Paul's Quadrant Coalition, the City of Norfolk's Fair and Impartial Policing initiative, My Brother's Keeper, and the City Manager's Senior Pastors Roundtable.

Michelle Cook Tidewater Gardens St. Paul's Development Coalition



Ms. Michelle Cook is a two-term President of the Tenant Management Council for the Tidewater Gardens public housing community. She also serves as the Vice President of the St. Paul's Development Coalition, Inc., a group consisting of concerned residents, business owners, church leaders and other stakeholders who are working to ensure responsible, equitable and community ownership of the re-development of the St. Paul's area of Norfolk.

Ms. Cook became a dedicated community volunteer after spending ten years on dialysis before receiving a kidney transplant. She is especially proud of her civic work with Empower Hampton Roads. In 2012 there was discussion of moving the voting precinct from the St. Paul's area. As a part of this group, she went before Norfolk City Council and

successfully lobbied to keep the voting precinct in place at Ruffner Middle School. She has also worked with Bev Sell and the Mobile Market, bringing fresh fruits and vegetables to the St. Paul's area.

Ms. Cook attended Granby High School and is now working on her GED. She is the mother of 3 grown sons, grandmother of eight grandchildren, and attends St. Paul's Deliverance Christian Center.

A Norfolk native, Ms. Cook is the oldest of 8 siblings from a stable, loving and supportive family. She says it is her duty to "pay it forward".

William Harrell

CEO and President, Hampton Roads Transit (HRT)

Following his appointment in April 2012, Mr. Harrell established a vision to reshape HRT into the most efficient and customer-driven transit agency in Virginia. Mr. Harrell believes the foundation of a viable transit system that supports the regional economy and quality of life will require a dedicated funding stream. This will ensure frequent and reliable service to key destinations. In this regard, he has initiated a community conversation on this important topic called Connect Hampton Roads and is advocating for a high frequency core regional network to expand economic opportunity and diversification.



Prior to his role with GRT, Mr. Harrell served as city manager for the city of Chesapeake. Harrell is also a Credentialed Manager with the International

City/County Management Association. With over 32 years in public service, Mr. Harrell has served in various leadership roles including chief administrative officer in Richmond, Virginia, assistant city manager in Greensboro, North Carolina and Suffolk, Virginia.

Mr. Harrell is a Board member of Rail-Volution, a national organization committed to building livable communities with transit. He is the Treasurer of the Virginia Transit Association, an active member of the American Public Transportation Association and a regional board member of the Hampton Roads Chamber of Commerce.

Among his many obligations as a Sr. Pastor, he also serves as the Chairman of the Garden of Hope, CDC, Chaplain to the City of Norfolk's Sheriff's Office, Chairman of the Norfolk Jail Ministry's Board of Directors, Director of the



Christian Student Fellowship at Norfolk State University, and as Chairman of the Board of the Norfolk School Board.

Dr. Houston is a Native of South Florida and now resides in the Hampton Roads area with his wife of many years Sharon M. Houston, who also serves as the church's Director of Ministries. She also worked for Stihl Incorporated for 22 years, where she was promoted from Administrative Assistant to Export Coordinator, and finally to Export Specialist and



Systems Analyst. Ms. Love resigned from Stihl Incorporated to start this organization that was her passion and her purpose in life.



He led the people of God at First Baptist Church in Norfolk in the renovation of the New Shepherd's Village @ Park Avenue, an assisted living facility, and the construction of a 38,000 sq. ft. facility, The Murray Center, which contains the READY Academy Christian School, the Taste 'N See Banquet Facility, the Renew Counseling Center and the church's Administration Wing.

Dr. Murray is a graduate of Hampton University, and the Boston University School of Theology, where he earned both his Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry

degrees. He also studied at Robert College, Istanbul, Turkey as a Foreign Exchange Student. He presently serves as the chairman of the Foundation Fund's Board of Directors that manages the Convention's invested funds. He is a former President of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Convention.

He has also served as president of the Minister's Council of ABCOTS. For four years, he was chairman of the Board of Directors of the William A. Hunton YMCA, the oldest African American YMCA in America. He is a member and the host pastor of The Tidewater Metro Baptist Ministers Conference. Most of all, Dr. Murray is a dedicated Christian. 
